Kidney Donors to Climb 3 Volcanoes in Guatemala to Advocate for Living Kidney Donation

April 11, 2023 – December 2023 a group of 18 kidney donors will attempt to climb 3 volcanoes in Guatemala, totaling over 12,000 vertical feet, in 4 days. Their goal is to demonstrate that living organ donors can accomplish any physical challenge that could be achieved by a person with two kidneys. This is the second One Kidney Climb, following in the footsteps of the success of the first, which took place March 2022 where 20 living donors summited Mt Kilimanjaro in Tanzania, Africa.

The climbers are all members of the nonprofit Kidney Donor Athletes (KDA), founded in 2018. “Something important to all of us is to normalize kidney donations,” KDA supporter and climber Patty Graham said. “We’re not heroes. We are normal people leading normal lives.”

KDA group leader and board member, Chris Sullivan explained the benefits of the trek, that “showing the world that living kidney donation does not negatively impact your life, in fact it makes it better. As a living kidney donor, I can do everything I did before donation.” The group is fundraising to promote awareness and raise funds for the many educational, sponsorship, and advocacy programs KDA offers those considering donation or post donation.

Currently, there are nearly 100,000 people on the waiting list in the United States in need of a kidney. With an average wait time of three to five years for a transplant, 13 of them die every day. Increasing the number of living donations would significantly reduce the number of unnecessary deaths from kidney failure, as kidneys from living donors last, on average, 50% longer than those from deceased donors.
